Manatees have long, flattened lungs along their backbones. The lungs provide buoyancy, helping them float in the water.

Manatees breathe through their nostrils. With one breath at the water's surface, they replace 90 per cent of old air with new. In comparison, humans only replace 10 per cent of air per breath. The manatee's great air exchange allows for extended dives to eat plants such as seagrass. While most dives last only 2 to 5 minutes, some last as long as 20 minutes!

Transparent membranes protect a manatee's small eyes while it swims. Manatee ears are also small, but their hearing is good. Sensitive face whiskers help them navigate underwater.

Manatees paddle with their tails and steer with their front flippers. The flippers also help them pull plants into their mouths. The upper lip is prehensile and grabs vegetation much like an elephant's trunk. In fact, the elephant is their closest land-living relative!

The tiny nails on the end of manatee flippers are similar to elephant toenails. The animals' thick grey skin and sparse hair are also similar. And both have "marching molars." These teeth grow at the back of the jaw and slowly move forward replacing molars worn down from grinding vegetation. (Marvelous Manatees by Guy Belleranti)
